What is Safeguarding

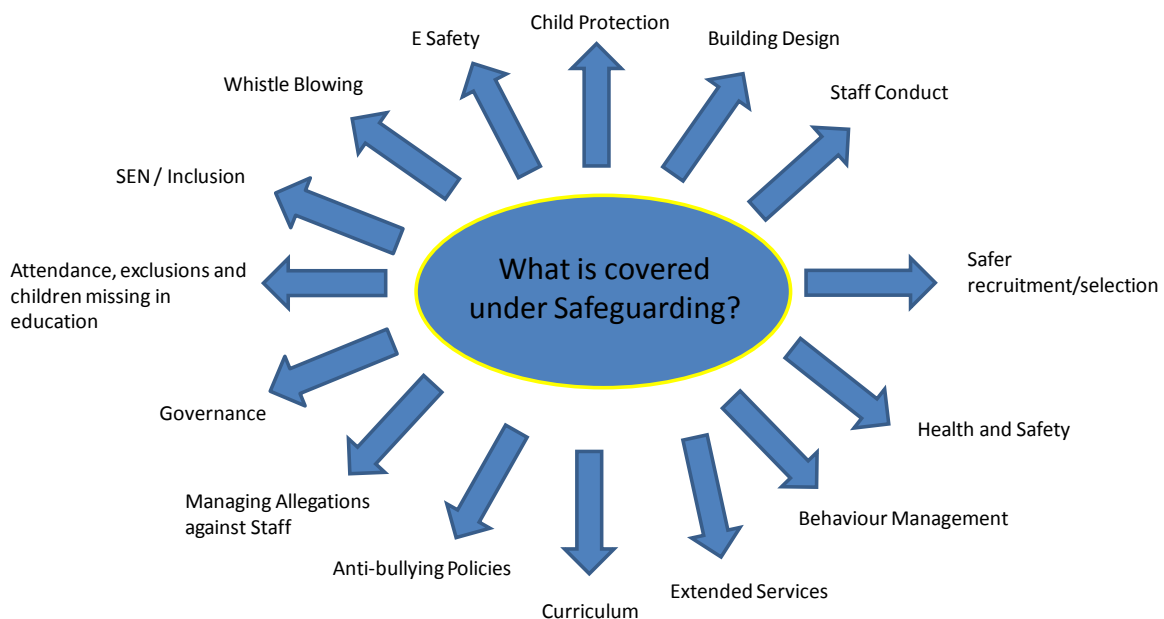
Safeguarding is defined in paragraph 4 of Keeping Children Safe in Education as;

protecting children from maltreatment; preventing impairment of children's health or development; ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care; and taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.



Safeguarding is about protecting everyone not just children, it is our responsibility to ensure that everyone who we work with and who comes into our Academies are kept safe, this includes all visitors, staff, students, external agencies, parents, carers cleaners and cooks are made aware of our procedures to do this.

The diagram below outlines some of the areas covered within the academy under safeguarding as discussed in the recent CLF annual Safeguarding training.
