The children have been busy creating Mother's Day cards. They have taken a lot of care in their work and I'm sure you will love the finished products.


Year 3 and Reception have both been on local area visits and enjoyed exploring their local area. There were a lot of tired children on Tuesday afternoon!

#### Cake sale


